We already announced the following change, but the by-laws say it must appear in the newsletter **in two consecutive newsletters** before we vote, so we are doing that, and the vote will be at the September meeting. We are complying with the rules.

#### **Proposed By-Law Change:**

Subsection 3 of Article XI - Board of Directors shall be altered to read as follows:

In the absence of the President and Vice- President, the quorum present may choose a chairman for that meeting. If a quorum is not present, a lesser number may adjourn the meeting to a later date as agreed upon at the meeting wherein discussed.

## Creating a web-friendly artist bio

- Avoid cliches. "I love color" is an obvious one. So is the desire to be an artist from a very young age. Everyone wants to be an artist when they're young!
- Think "by-line." If we were reading an article about you, what would be an attention-grabbing by-line? So think about your bio/statement as a miniarticle about you. What will your title be? And what's your by-line?
- Be confident, not tentative. We know we've broken out from the typical 9-5 jobs but don't feel quite confident that other artists have accepted us into their ranks.
- Eliminate tentative words. Take out words like "try", "attempt", "began to try", "started to make", etc. Use active voice over passive.
- We talk about our work as if it simply appeared in front of us. As if it has a life of its own, separate from us. But the reason it appeared in this world is because of you, the artist. Don't be afraid of that.
- Tell your audience what they want to hear, not what you want to tell them. What a customer wants to know about pottery is, is it functional, can it go in the microwave, and does it have lead in the glazes. Don't write a bio/statement for other artists, write it for your audience.

### Photographing your art (for the web)

#### FOCUS, FOCUS, FOCUS.

Make sure your art is in FOCUS!

Take a high resolution photo, but put up a low resolution (and small) photo. This makes it unappealing to use in other places, but gives the web viewer an idea.

Don't use funny angles. Take the photo straight on. Don't show the frame (for 2-D art)

Use a white or black background (for 3-D art) (Hint: Black looks SPECTACULAR on the new website.)

## What about copyrights?

Any professional who does not want their images used without permission can and should protect them. Use small versions of each image, just big enough to fit the space.

Put in your e-mail address and a link on or near each image.

Watermarks can be had free. The simplest watermark is a URL linked to your copyright and reprint policy. These sit within the image, covering them only partially. I never use such images without credit. There are many watermark programs out there. Digimarc is popular, and has been available as a plug-in to Adobe Photoshop since 1996. Other such programs include WatermarkIt, WinWatermark, and AoAoPhoto. Watermark 0.0.1 is open source.

HTML commands can be written that disable the right-click function on any Web page. Like this: <body oncontextmenu="alert('You may not right click'); return false;">

# TRAG Gallery Featured Artist Dennis Stafford

Retired Log Truck Driver, Dennis
Stafford is the TRAG Gallery featured artist.
Dennis lives in the Colton area with his
wife. He regularly joins a group of friends
at the Colton Café for a meal and
conversation. In 2007 while there he was
invited to take an oil painting class at a local
church taught be Betty Cumberland. After
declining several times, he decided to go to
the class to prove to them that he "couldn't
draw a stick figure", and that he couldn't
paint. Betty supplied him with what he
needed to complete a painting and
encouragement.

When he finished his first painting, he took it to the café and they took it from him and hung it on the café wall. That was the beginning of Dennis's painting career.

Dennis works with oils and a technique called "wet on wet". He took classes from Betty Cumberland and has watched the entire Bob Ross video series.

He now teaches what he calls beginning "Red Neck" oil painting classes with the wet on wet technique. He gets inspiration from conversations with friends who will mention a topic that will spark an idea for a painting. Dennis likes to be able to draw the viewer into his paintings.

Drop by the Colton Café to see the work of Dennis and his "Red NecK" students on the wall of the café. Dennis is an active member of the Three Rivers Artist Guild and Vice President of the Canby Art Association. You can see his work on display at the TRAG gallery trough the month of September.

#### Show your work in the TRAG Gallery

(Corner of 7th and Center Street), in Oregon City, Oregon 97045. **The requirements to participate in the gallery are:** 

Membership in Three Rivers Artist Guild must be current.

All artwork must be made by the artist.

A \$25 fee for the 3 month installation period, payable on receipt of artwork, will be collected by the gallery for insurance, advertising and gallery costs.

A commission of 25% will be deducted from sales. Artist receives 75% commission on sales via check, which is distributed within 30 days from the month of sale.

Displaying artists are to staff the gallery one day (or two 1/2 days) a month.

Artist provides a one page Artist Statement with photo, and 12 business cards.

All art is installed for a 3 month rotation period.

Art may not be removed without written approval by the Gallery Committee.

Initial acceptance into the gallery is by committee jury.

In the entry hallway of The Pioneer Center, TRAG will be hosting an Artist Showcase for the purposes of providing an opportunity to TRAG artists who would not otherwise have a booth and to display the varied talent within our guild. Artists are invited to display 3-5 pieces (depending upon size) of art, along with artist's information and cards. A TRAG member will be present during show hours and will manage sales. The proceeds will be distributed at the end of the show. Check or cash sales only. Artists will unpack and pack their own art at start and end of show. There will be some tables available but artists with large, heavy or irregular shaped artwork may be asked to provide their own stands.

#### Information: THIS IS A JURIED SHOW

- Artists in the 2011 Holiday show need not have their work juried if medium has not changed. New guild members as well as those whose medium has changed, email images to carolbresky@gmail.com
- All art work must be created by the participating artist, including any kits, post cards or prints.
- A booth space may be shared by a maximum of 2 artists (excluding Showcase) and the artists must be
  present during the sale. Volunteers will be present to booth sit as needed for artist breaks only.
- Incense and scented items (like candles and infusers) will not be accepted due to allergies and sensitivities
- Set up on Friday from 4 pm 7 pm from the parking lot through the side doors. No arrivals before 4:00 pm as the committee will be marking off booth spaces.
- There are limited electrical outlets (provide your own 20 ft cord, 500 watts limit). Electrical needs may
  determine space location. If tables are used in your booth,table coverings are required and must
  reach the floor. All cartons and containers must be out of sight during show hours.
- Artists will be responsible for their own display equipment and for setting up and tearing down their displays.
- Artists will be responsible for their own sales transactions (excluding Showcase)

- This is a secure building but no security guard at night. Any property left overnight will be the sole risk
  of the artist.
- Demonstrations at your space are encouraged (except for oil paints or odorous materials).
- Pets will not be allowed in the display area, due to allergies and fragility of art objects.
